## Attendance

I am pleased to say that attendance at the St Clement site is slowly increasing and has risen from **93.8%** to **94.1%**. Unfortunately, this is still below the government's target of **96%**. Attendance at the All Saints site is currently **94.7%**.

Of the 9 primary schools on the Island, Eastchurch Primary School still has the **lowest attendance at 94.4%**! Please help us to improve by only allowing your child to stay at home when they are really ill.
