

Eastchurch Primary School: Sports Premium Grant

At Eastchurch, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Nature of expenditure in 2015 - 2016

- Minibus for use to transport children to clubs, competitions and other sporting events; these included a group of Key Stage 2 children going to see a Kent Cricket Match at their ground in Canterbury, a group of Year 3 and 4 children attending the Peacefields football tournament and ceremony at Oasis Academy
- Money towards the Inflatable Fitness day.
- Through the Rio Olympic events the children were involved in a range of activities including cross curricular activity days involving art. The children's well-being was also promoted and staff had a well-being training session.
- Subsidised funding for Bikeability for Years 4-6.
- Termly Karate sessions for all year groups.
- Tennis coaching for Year 4 at both sites.
- Each site had 2 whole day sessions with an athlete (Tim Prendergast) who introduced a range of taster fitness activities to them.
- Improving staff professional learning to up skill teachers through CPD at the Oasis Academy. This has covered Dance, Dodgeball, Athletics, Netball, Rounders, Football and Handball. The PE leaders also attended a Sports Disability course.
- Buying into existing local sports networks, links through Oasis Academy,

this included an end of year awards ceremony with trophies and certificates.

- Securing time for our subject leaders to attend CPD and competitions.
- Paying for the children to participate in local school games and competitions.
- Swimming lessons for Year 6 and the Year 5 and 6 swimming gala.
- Purchasing resources in order to teach the lessons linked to the CPD.

Impact of spending 2015 - 2016

- As part of the Island School's partnership, the school has benefitted from the termly CPD sessions run by the academy. As a result, the teachers have enhanced their teaching skills and pupils have benefitted from improved PE teaching.
- The two PE subject leaders have been able to attend PAL meetings at the Oasis Academy where ideas have been shared across other schools in the collaboration and refresher training on different sports has up-skilled the subject leaders on specialist areas such as sports for disabled pupils, this has then been disseminated to other staff where possible.
- Increased pupil participation to after-school clubs, lunchtime clubs and competitions, the school minibus has enabled us to support parents with transport to these events.
- A range of specialist sports coaching has been offered, the children have had specialist teaching in tennis, karate and athletics.
- The whole school has participated in skipping workshops where traditional skipping games were taught. Ropes have been purchased for use in recreational sessions. The school also had a sponsored skipping day to raise money for the British Heart Foundation.
- The school is proud of the number of sports clubs that it has on after school. Each term a new sports club has been run leading up to a competitive event.
- Positive attitudes to health and well-being through the well-being activities.
- Success in local competitions: This year we have entered teams into competitions in: Football, Netball, Cross country, Cricket, Swimming, Athletics and Rounders. These competitions have been run in connection with the Oasis Academy and most schools on the Island and Sittingbourne entered. Our Athletics team was the most successful coming, first in shot put, second in javelin and third in the 500m.
- More Year 6 children are now able to swim.

- Improved links between the children at the 2 sites, including clubs for whole cohorts.
- Improved Sports day with more competitive races and new resources.

Planned Expenditure of Sports Premium Grant 2016-2017

- Continue working with specialist teachers and training our staff further, especially staff who are new to our school.
- Look into a sport tracking system for pupils.
- As part of the PALs priorities a 'Change for Life' club is planned to encourage less active pupils to try a range of sports.
- To encourage greater participation in sports clubs.
- Continued use of the school minibus for use to transport children to clubs and competitions.
- Provide further CPD on how to teach PE effectively, particularly for new members of staff.
- Buying into existing local sports networks links through Oasis Academy.
- Replacing old resources with newer better quality ones.
